SHIPPING IS A FOUNDATION OF THE REGIONAL ECONOMY

- Bi-national partnership
- 237,000 jobs related to maritime transport
- Supports \$35 billion in economic activity
- Approximately 140 M tons / year
- Bulk / breakbulk cargo
- Serving steel-making, agriculture, energy, mining industries

NEW SOO LOCK CONSTRUCTION

- Soo Locks support 87,000 U.S. jobs
- Authorized by Congress in 1986
- First new system lock since 1968
- 100% federal expense
- \$1.37 billion funded to date
- \$800 million more to complete
- Under construction now





ICEBREAKING

- · Coast Guard mission loosely defined
- Great Lakes Winter Commerce Act will codify the icebreaking mission and set performance standards
- Atrophy in USCG icebreaking fleet
 - 1979 14 vessels
 - 2019 9 vessels
- New heavy icebreaker authorized by Congress in 2015 = \$350 million
- Build Back Better Bill = \$350 million
- FY23 request = \$40 million





PORT INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

• \$293 million for FY2019

\$225 million for FY2020

\$230 million for FY2021

\$684 million for FY2022

• MARAD - 80/20 cost sharing



GREAT LAKES COASTAL RESILIENCY STUDY


- Lake levels highest in recorded history
- Ports of Milwaukee and Oswego damaged
- Study authorized by Congress in 2018 & 2020
- Similar to North Atlantic Coast Comprehensive Study
- Supported by all Great Lakes states
- Cost = \$11 million





2022 ECONOMIC IMPACT STUDY AND INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT SURVEY

- Will measure 2022 shipping season
- Direct / indirect / induced jobs dependent on Great Lakes Seaway shipping
- Will measure Business activity
- Local / State / Federal tax contribution
- Results by region, country, state/province, port, and policy issue
- Will measure public and private sector infrastructure investments
